

# *EAB in Illinois Timeline*

**June 13, 2006**—EAB Discovered in Illinois (Windings– Campton Township—Kane Cty).

**July 13, 2005**—EAB Confirmed in Wilmette (Northern Cook County).

**July 19, 2006**—Nuisance Declaration Issued by IDA and EAB Quarantine established within Kane Cty—(limited area).

**July 21, 2006**—EAB Confirmed in Evanston (Northern Cook County).

**July 27, 2006**—IDNR Parks ban any firewood brought in from quarantined area.

**Sept. 1, 2006**—EAB confirmed in Winnetka (Northern Cook County).

**Sept. 15, 2006**—Governor Blagojevich appoints EAB Management and Science Advisory Panel.

**Oct. 16, 2006**—IDA hosts first EAB training workshop using trees harvested from the Windings.

**Nov. 9, 2006**—IDA amends EAB quarantine to include limited area in northern Cook County.

**Nov. 29, 2006**—USDA issues statewide quarantine for the entire state of Illinois.

**Dec. 5, 2006**—EAB Trap Tree Survey program proves effective as EAB is confirmed in Elgin (Kane County).

**January 10, 2007**—IDA expands quarantine to include all of Kane County.

**March 8, 2007**—IDA offers a one-time EAB Population Reduction Strategy to remove all known-EAB-infested trees within a half mile of confirmed locations in Kane and northern Cook counties.

**April 27, 2007**—IDA amends the EAB quarantine around Kane and northern Cook in order to include necessary yard waste and processing sites and transfer stations.

**May 22, 2007**—Governor proclaims EAB Awareness Week.

**July 11, 2007**—EAB found in Peru, IL (LaSalle County—Currently, the farthest West known location in North America).

**July 16, 2007**—EAB found in Glendale Heights (DuPage County).

**July 19, 2007**—IDA dramatically expands EAB quarantine to include all or parts of the 18 northeastern-most counties of the state of Illinois.

**November 20, 2007**—EAB found in Carol Stream (DuPage County).

December 19, 2007—IDA urges caution to public works and tree professional as they handle storm debris.

**January 9, 2008**—IDA confirms EAB in Geneva (Kane) and Hazel Crest (southern Cook).

**April 10, 2008**—IDA concludes destructive bark-peeling in 22 northern Illinois counties.

**April 21, 2008**—IDA begins deployment of Purple Trap EAB Detection Program.
