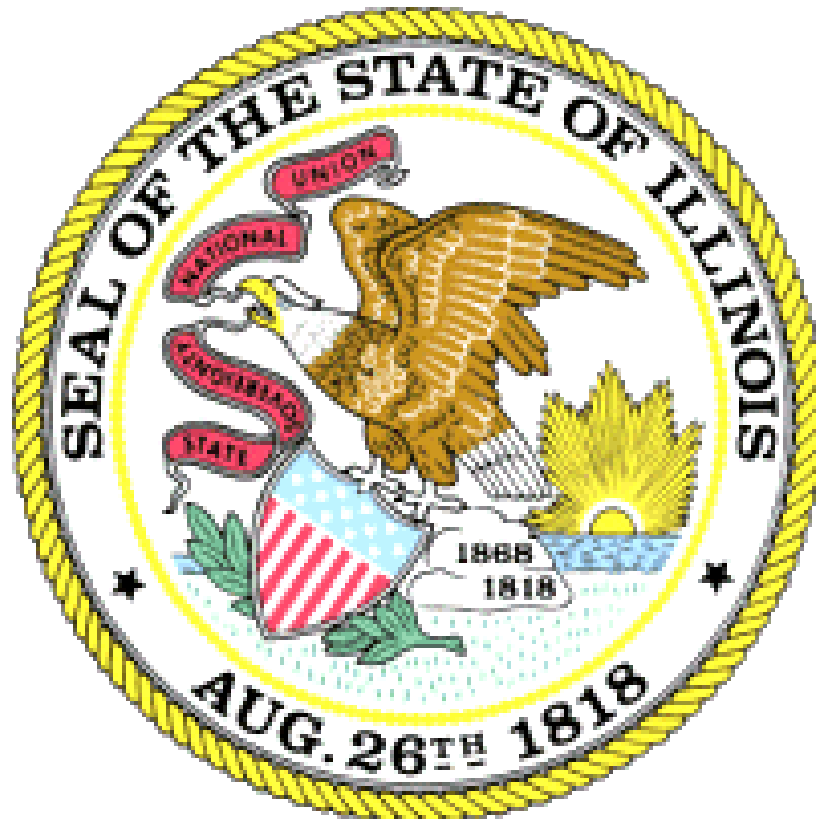

Organizations Involved in Regulating Food Safety

- **Federal – U.S.F.D.A.**
U.S.D.A. (meat and poultry)
- **State – IL Dept of Public Health (IDPH)**
IL Dept of Agriculture (IDOA)
- **Local - 96 certified LHD's in IL**

FDA / IDPH / IL LHD's

- The FDA provides regulatory guidance to state health departments.
- IDPH delegates it's retail regulatory authority to the certified LHD's
- LHD inspects all retail food establishments

FDA → IDPH → LHD's

95 Local Health Departments

- **60,000 – 70,000 Food establishments in Illinois**
- **Restaurants, Bars, grocery stores, retail stores, etc.**
- **Also cover temporary, mobile and seasonal operations**

- **Modified HACCP**

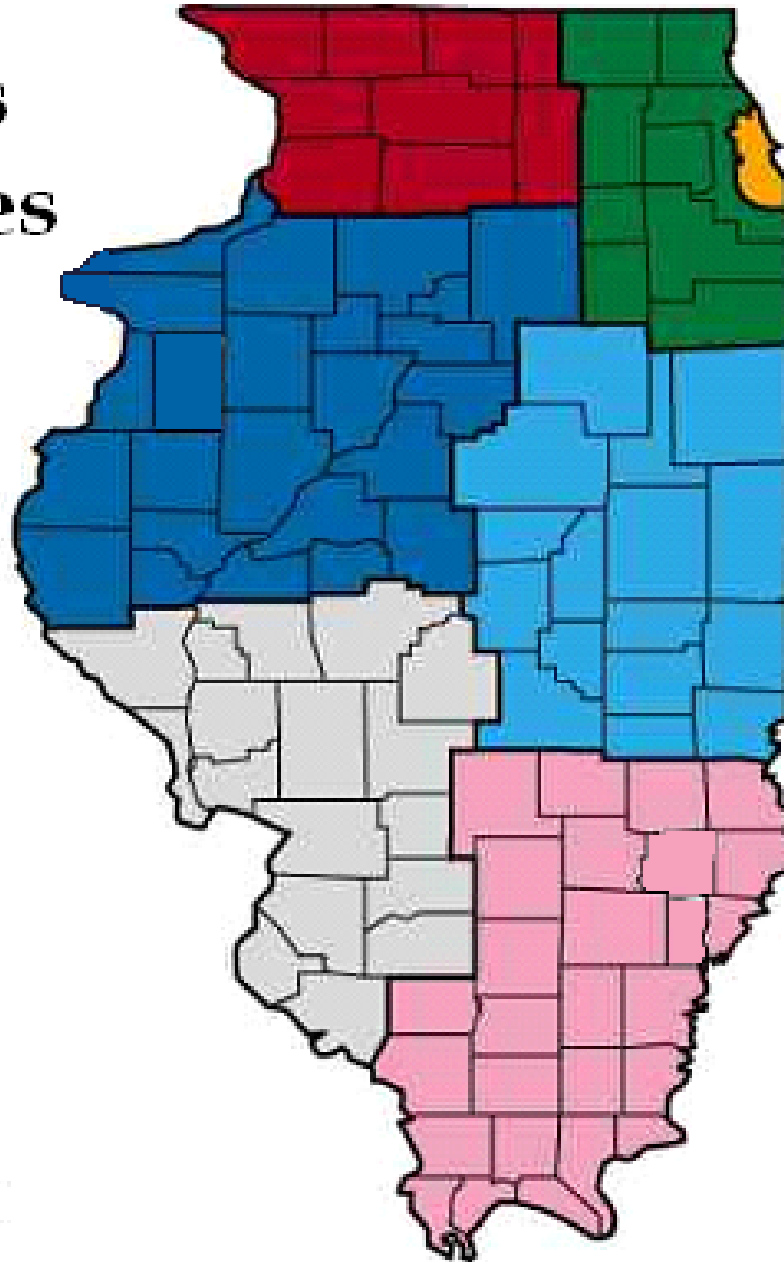


UNIFORM INSPECTION PROGRAM

- To ensure uniform and standardized food inspections throughout the state, Illinois provides standardization of all LHDs.
- This determines if they are marking the inspection reports properly
- Also if they have the knowledge and are able to instruct their food inspection staff

Illinois has 102 Counties

Regulatory Duties

- **salvage warehouses**
- **shellfish processors**
- **wholesalers**
- **food processors**
- **bottled water processors**
- **dairy plants**
- **dairy farms**
- **dairy processors**
- **low acid canned food processors**
- **4,600 establishments**



Applicable Codes

- Grade “A” Pasteurized Milk and Milk Products Code
- Manufactured Dairy Products Code
- Food Manufacturing, Processing, Packaging and Holding Regulations
- Code of Federal Regulations are also adopted as Illinois regulations

Five Most Common Food Types Implicated in Illinois FBI

Fruits and Veg.	1	1 (17)
Poultry	2	4 (7)
Other Salads	3	-
Beef	4	2 (10)
Pork	5	4 (7)
Seafood	-	3 (9)



Technical Information Bulletins

- TIB Food #30 – Sanitation Guidelines for Farmers Markets, Producer Markets and Other Outdoor Sales Events
 - Explains exemptions for fresh fruits and vegetables, produce stands
 - Explains difference between these and temporary food stands (regulated by the local jurisdiction)

TIB # 30 – cont...

- Lists foods with no restrictions, foods allowed with some restrictions and foods prohibited (generally foods that are prohibited in any facility)
- Foods must be from an approved source, not home made. FDD will work with operator on proposal to use or build an approved facility for food processing
- Provides basic labeling guidance



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- Will provide basic information regarding the regulations that are applicable to the food processing operation you propose
- Will review HACCP plan or food process
- Will review proposed facility or will conduct review of plans, including private well and septic system
- Will collect water or other samples as needed
- Will review labels in advance of printing



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- Types of facilities that require a license, permit or certificate:
 - Grade A or Manufactured Dairy Plant and related facilities or professions
 - Bottled Drinking Water Plant or Drinking Water Source
 - Shellfish Shipper, Re-shipper or Packer
 - Retail or Wholesale Salvage Facility



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
